Lake Akan is renowned as a sacred place for trout fishing, along with the Akan River. Similarly, Lake Kussharo, which is the source of the Kushiuro River, is a popular fishing spot for both the lake and the river. Furthermore, one of the distinctive features of the Kushiuro region is fishing in the wetland rivers. Canoe fishing in the Kushiuro Shitsugen and Bekanbeushi Wetlands is also highly recommended. Additionally, you can hire fishing boats for sea fishing, allowing you to enjoy various fishing activities according to your preferences.

Recommended spots for experiencing activities

Kushiuro Shitsugen Course

A popular course is exploring Kushiuro Shitsugen National Park on the back of "Dosanko," a native breed of working horses that have been used in agriculture in Hokkaido. Even the forested areas that are difficult to reach by car or on foot can be comfortably explored while being gently swayed on the horse's back. Seaside trekking, with a view of the vast Pacific coastline, is also recommended. The horses will leisurely guide you along the cool and refreshing sandy beach, allowing you to relax and enjoy the sound of the waves. It's a moment of pure relaxation.



Mount Oakan (1,371m), Mount Meakan (1,499m), and Mount Hakuto (950m) are volcanoes that offer a panoramic view of Lake Akan. Additionally, Mount Mashu (857m) is a magnificent mountain that provides a breathtaking view of Lake Mashu from its summit. The climbing season generally lasts from June to October, and you can enjoy climbing at your own pace while appreciating the scenery according to the season and the chosen route. Even on longer routes, a round trip can be completed in about 5 to 6 hours. It is recommended to depart in the morning, take a break at the summit during lunchtime, and return leisurely. You can fully experience the unique nature of the national park.
