

Breathtaking experiences in Akkeshi-Kiritappu-Konbumori Quasi-National Park

Stretching across four towns, Akkeshi-Kiritappu-Konbumori Quasi-National Park was designated as the sixth national park in Hokkaido in 2021. The Kiritappu Wetland and Bekanbeushi Wetland are ideal fields for birdwatching, where you can observe magnificent birds such as sea eagles, white-tailed eagles, and Japanese red-crowned cranes, which is designated as a Special National Treasure. You can also enjoy leisurely canoeing. The coastal area with continuous sea cliffs features beautiful capes and is popular as a trekking course with
